FACTS

- 1. The Shoshone who lived here were hunters and gatherers and lived in temporary shelters known as Wikiups.
- 2. Epiphytes are tree dwelling species like ferns, mosses and lichen which are found in this park.
- 3. The roadrunner, found in this park, can clock up to 20 mph.
- 4. Acidic boiling water and mud pots are next to many walkways in this park. Watch your step!
- 5. Enjoy a ride through "Tunnel Log". This tree fell in 1937 and is used today as a tunnel through the park.
- 6. Found here, the Anacapa Island lighthouse was the last permanent lighthouse built on the West Coast.
- 7. The giant sequoia found in this park sprouts from seeds and can live over 3,000 years.
- 8. El Capitan and Half Dome are two of the more famous rock formations found here.
- 9. The 'UA'U seabird found here makes a call that sounds just like its name: oo-AH-oo.
- 10. One of the rarest and largest birds in the world, the California Condor, can be found here.
