FACTS

- 1. Herds of bison can be found all throughout the park.

 Each bison can weigh up to 2,000 pounds.
- 2. The Lakotas called this park "mako sica" or "land bad" because of its extreme temperatures, lack of water, and rugged terrain.
- 3. The cliff dwellings at this national park are spectacular.
- 4. American Dipper birds eat insects and larvae in the rivers of this park. They can bob up and down at up to 60 dips per minute.
- 5. At this park, Old Faithful's eruption expels up to 8,400 gallons of water at a height of up to 180 feet.
- 6. Most rocks in this park are sedimentary, made up of rocks that have been weathered, eroded, and deposited in layers.
- 7. Noted for their succulent stems, pads, or branches with scales and spines, instead of leaves, this national park has eleven species of cactus.
- 8. This park is named after our 26th president who first came to the Dakotas to hunt bison.
- Snakes and lizards, the only reptiles found here help control the insect and rodent population.
- 10. This park is a sacred site to the Lakota, Cheyenne and other tribes in the area.
